

Theme Of The Bible

"Theme" means "The main message; the overall view or central subject." Thus, the theme of the Bible must be **REDEMPTION IN CHRIST JESUS**. With this fact clearly before our minds, we note the following:

- 1. The LOVE And PROMISES Of God. God so loved that He gave His only begotten Son (John 3:16). He manifested (proved) His love by that gift (Rom. 5:8-9). John tells us that greater love hath no man than to lay down your life for your friends (John 15:13). God promised to bless all the nations (families) of the earth (Gen. 12:3). He kept the promise (Rom. 4:21). He promised to give us a Saviour, and He did (Matt. 1:21). He promised us the gospel, and He kept that promise (I Cor. 15:1-4). He has made and kept many additional promises.
- **2. SIN Is The Problem!** All have sinned (Rom. 3:23). The apostle Paul further tells us that the price we will pay for unforgiven sin is spiritual death (Rom. 6:23); separation from God eternally (II Thess. 1:7-9). When we reach the stage of our life in which we know right from wrong (able to discern good from bad), sin enters our life. But we should rejoice to know that...
- **3. CHRIST Is The Answer!** We have hope through Christ and His Word. Without Christ we have no hope (I Tim. 1:1). The overall theme of the Bible is briefly reflected in Romans 15:13: "Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope." The prophets of the Old Testament spoke of Christ, the Son of God, coming to earth to be our Saviour (Isa. 53; Isa. 7:14). Jesus stated that through the Word, the Holy Bible, we can know of Him as Saviour (John 5:39). We can know the truth, and the truth can make us free from sin (John 8:32; John 17:17).
- 4. The CHURCH Was Built By Christ Where Salvation Is Found. Jesus said, as found in Matthew 16:18, "I will build my church." He did just as He said He would do! He purchased the church with His own blood (Acts 20:28). On the day of Pentecost (Acts 2), over 1900 years ago, the church of our Lord began. Salvation is found in Christ (Eph. 1:3, 7; Col. 1:13-14). The saved are added to the church (Acts 2:47).

The Theme Of The Bible – Our salvation in Christ Jesus. Christ shows us how to be saved, in Him. Christ shows us how to live. Christ shows us how to love, be kind to others, to be compassionate and forgiving. Christ shows us how to put the will of God first in our life. Christ shows us how we may reach heaven after this life on earth – by obeying the will of the Father (Matt. 7:21).



The First Sin

Genesis 3

After creation, God placed Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden to live. It was a beautiful place. Think of the most beautiful place you have ever seen – the Garden of Eden was even more beautiful. God prepared this for them. Adam and Eve were given the responsibility of caring for the garden.

God told them they could eat of the fruit of all the trees, except one! Of the fruit "of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil" God told them "thou shalt not eat of it" (Gen. 2:17). We do not know the kind of fruit it was, since the Bible does not say. Some have said it was an apple, but we should not say this, since God did not tell us.

Satan appeared to Eve in the form of a serpent. He tempted her to eat of the forbidden fruit, by telling her that she would NOT die, as God had told them (Gen. 3:4). Satan lied to Eve. In fact, Satan is the father of lies.

Eve saw that the fruit looked good, was good for food, and (according to Satan) would make her wise, so she ate of the forbidden fruit. Eve sinned! What was wrong with Eve eating of this fruit?

Eve then gave some of the fruit to Adam, and he also ate of the fruit that God said not to eat. Today, it is also very easy to be tempted or led by our friends to do things we should not do.

The eyes of both Adam and Eve were "opened" — as they realized they had disobeyed God. They "knew that they were naked" and sewed fig leaves together to make aprons. God spoke, and when Adam and Eve heard God's voice, they were afraid and tried to hide from Him. They learned that no one can hide from God. It is NOT possible to hide from God. He knows everything we do, everything we say, everything we think.

God said, "Where art thou?" God asked them if they had eaten the forbidden fruit. Adam blamed Eve! Eve blamed the serpent for lying to her and making her eat of the fruit.

God punished Adam and Eve for their **sin** (Gen. 3:16-19). God always will punish us when we sin (Rom. 6:23). God drove Adam and Eve out of the garden (Gen. 3:24). He also punished them in other ways. How did God punish Adam? Eve?

God told Adam and Eve what He wanted them to do. God meant what He said. God will bless all who obey Him – and will punish all who disobey Him.



Noah And The Ark

Noah And The Ark

Genesis 6-7-8

People in the world became **WICKED** and bad, to the point that God said He was even sorry that He had created man. Because He hated sin so much, He decided to destroy the world with a **FLOOD**. God still hates every false way (Psm. 119:104).

In all the world, God found only one family who were living righteously and godly. This man was **NOAH** and his family.

In the New Testament, the Hebrew writer tells us that Noah "... being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house ..." Because Noah was doing what God wanted him to do, God took care of Noah. God told him about the coming flood, and then provided a way by which he could save himself and his family.

God gave detail instructions concerning the ARK that Noah was to build. The dimensions were to be 300 cubits long, 50 cubits wide and 30 cubits high. Since a cubit is about 18" long, this is about 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high (about one and one-half football fields long). GOPHER wood was to be used, tarred in and out. The ark was to be three stories high with one WINDOW and one DOOR. The ark was to be a BIG boat where Noah, his wife, their three sons, and the son's wives, along with all animals were to live during the flood. It took Noah a long time to build this BIG ark.

It took Noah over 100 years to complete the ark. God told Noah to gather all kinds of **ANIMALS** and birds, two of every kind, male and female to take into the ark. Noah was a man of great faith (Heb. 11:7), and again Noah did as God commanded.

When all the animals and Noah with his **FAMILY** were in the ark, God shut the door. The rains came for 40 days and nights. All the earth was covered with water. Every living thing was destroyed, except those in the ark. The ark finally came to rest on Mt. **ARARAT**. After many days, Noah found the earth clean and dry again. Read about the birds Noah sent from the ark to determine if there was dry land. Noah, his family, and all the animals came out of the ark. They were to go forth and replenish the earth once again.


Noah **THANKED** God for saving him and his family from the flood. Noah worshipped God by building an altar and making an **OFFERING** on the altar to God. God then made a promise to never destroy the earth with water again. We are reminded of this promise each time we see the rainbow.



Joseph - In Egypt

Genesis 39-40

In our last lesson, we learned that Joseph was sold by his own brothers to Midianites who sold him to Potiphar in Egypt. They sold him for 20 pieces of silver. They took Joseph's coat and dipped it in blood, and returned it to their father. Jacob thought he had been killed by some wild beast. He mourned for his son for many days. His sons and daughters tried to comfort him, but they could not.

Potiphar was an Egyptian who was one of Pharaoh's officials. He was a

captain of the guard.

The Lord blessed Joseph in everything he did. He was soon put in charge of Potiphar's household. Potiphar trusted Joseph to care for everything he owned.

When Potiphar's wife saw how good looking Joseph was, she wanted him to be her boyfriend. Joseph knew this was wrong. He would have nothing to do with her. One day when he came into the house, she caught him by the arm and wanted him to come into her room. Do you know what Joseph did? He pulled out of his cloak and ran away! This was the right thing to do! Yet in one way it was a mistake also. He did the right thing in running away, if only he had taken his cloak.

Potiphar's wife took Joseph's cloak and told everyone that he had tried to force his affection on her, but that she screamed and he ran away, leaving his cloak. Can you imagine someone telling such a lie as that?

When Potiphar heard the story that his wife told, he was so angry with Joseph. He believed the lies of his wife. He took Joseph and put him in prison, where the king's prisoners were confined.

While Joseph was in prison the Lord was with him. He was liked by the prison keeper. The keeper put Joseph in charge of all of the prisoners, because the Lord was with him and everything that Joseph did, the Lord made him to prosper.

Pharaoh was angry with the butler and the baker and had them put in the same prison in which Joseph was confined. While there, these two men had a dream. Each dream had a different meaning. Joseph interpreted their dreams for them.

In our next lesson, we will notice the significance of these events, and how God's hand was providentially leading and guiding Joseph.



II Kings 5

A young maiden had been brought captive by the Syrians. She waited on Naaman's wife. She wanted to help Naaman get rid of his leprosy. She told her master's wife that she wished her Lord was back in Samaria. She said in Samaria



Jesus preached in many places. He was disturbed when the people did not repent. In our lesson today, Matthew records for us that Jesus charged cities with having seen the mighty works that had been done there – yet they had not repented. Jesus said to Chorazin and Bethsaida, "Woe unto thee..." He further told them that if these mighty works (miracles) had been done in Tyre and Sidon, then the people there would have repented. He told them that it would be easier for Tyre and SIDON at the day of judgment than for them. Jesus' statements to them was strong and to the point.

An outstanding invitation of Jesus is found in Matthew 11:28-30,

Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light (Matthew 11:28-30).

A Sinful Woman Washed Jesus' Feet And Anointed Him

A **PHARISEE** invited Jesus to eat with him at his house. Jesus went with him. While there, a sinner woman in the city brought an alabaster **BOX** of ointment in where Jesus was eating. She cried and started washing Jesus' feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. She then kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.

SIMON, the Pharisee, saw what she did and said things against the woman because she was a sinner. Jesus told Simon that He had some things to say to him about this. Jesus used an illustration to make His point, and then compared what Simon had NOT done to what this woman had DONE.

Jesus said that the womans sins were many, but that her sins were **FORGIVEN**, for she showed her love in a great way. If we love the Lord we will do what He says (John 14:15).

Jesus told the **SINFUL** woman "thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace." Jesus, with His twelve apostles, went to many cities and villages of Galilee, telling and showing the good news of the kingdom of God. As He traveled, there were different ones that took care of His needs, serving and feeding Him. Some of the ones that cared for Him had earlier been healed by Him.

John 11:1-54

Martha, and Lazarus lived in Bethany. Lazarus became sick. Mary and Martha sent word to Jesus that the one He loved was sick. Jesus waited two days before going to Bethany. He said to His disciples that their friend, Lazarus, was sleeping, and I will awake him. They thought He meant Lazarus was taking a nap. But Jesus then said plainly, "Lazarus is dead." 


