


When the sixth day ended, God had made the world and everything in it just as He had planned. He saw that it was very good!


On the seventh day God rested!



Joshua 5-6

A fter the children of Israel had crossed the Jordan River on dry land, all the kings of the Canaanites heard about it and their spirit was melted. They knew that God was powerful and on the side of the children of Israel.

Jericho was a city that was shut up. No one that lived inside went out, and none came in. The Lord told Joshua that He had given them Jericho. God told him what Joshua and his men of war had to do to overcome the large wall around the city.

God said: For six days all the men of war were to go around the city one time. On the seventh day, they were to go around the city seven times and the priests were to blow the trumpets. Then the people were to shout with a great shout. Until Joshua told the people to shout, they were to be quiet, not making any noise with their voice. The wall of the city would fall down flat.

Joshua rose up early and the priests took up the ark of the Lord. They did just as God had told them to do, going around the walls one time each day, for six days. On the seventh day, they went around seven times. The priests blew the trumpets and Joshua said, "Shout; for the Lord hath given you the city." Just as God had said, the wall around the city of Jericho fell down flat.

The children of Israel then went up into the city, and they took the city. They destroyed all that was in the city. They burned the city with fire. They saved the gold, silver and vessels of brass and of iron, putting them into the treasury of the house of the Lord.


Joshua saved Rahab the harlot and her family and all that she had, because she hid the messengers which Joshua sent to spy out Jericho. She then dwelt in Israel.


The Lord was good to Joshua. People everywhere heard about the great things that he had done.

Jonah 3-4

The Lord spoke to Jonah a second time. He told Jonah to get up, go to the great city of Nineveh, and preach. The Lord said He would tell Jonah what to preach.

Jonah arose and went into Nineveh, as the Lord had said. Nineveh was a great city, three days journey across.

After one day's journey into the city, Jonah cried and said that in forty days Nineveh would be overthrown. The people believed God and planned a fast. Each one put on sackcloth, and sat in ashes.

The king wondered if the Lord would turn and repent: and then turn from his fierce anger, that they would not perish.

God saw their works. They had turned from their evil way. God repented (changed His mind) of the evil that He said He would do to them, and did not do it.

This displeased Jonah and he was very angry. Jonah prayed unto the Lord. Jonah said God was gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness. He also said the Lord repented of the evil.

Jonah asked God to take his life. He said it was better for him to die than to live.

Being angry, Jonah went and sat on the east side of the city, and made a booth for himself. He sat in the shadow until he saw what would happen to the city.

The Lord prepared a gourd and made it come up as a shadow over his head to deliver him from his grief. Jonah was glad of the gourd. God also prepared a worm. It smote the gourd and it withered.

When the sun came up, the Lord caused a strong wind to beat upon Jonah's head. He fainted. He wanted to die.

The Lord pointed out to Jonah that he had no control over the gourd. Then the Lord said, "Should I not spare Nineveh, that great city, with more than six score thousand people and they can't tell their right hand from their left hand?"





Jesus - A Great Sermon # 2

Matthew 5-7

In Matthew 5, 67, we read of a great sermon that Jesus presented. Every word in the Bible is given to us by God. It is inspired by God (II Tim. 3:16-17).

Some of the things that Jesus taught in this great sermon was: We should do good to please God and to help other people. Do not do good just to have others see you or have them brag on you.

Jesus said to pray, but not like the hypocrites. They loved to pray where they could be seen and heard by others. A hypocrite is one who says to live one way, but lives another way.

Jesus also taught that to, "Lay up treasures in heaven, not on earth." It is more important to live right and prepare for living eternally with God, than to have a lot of money.

The Lord said that one can not be on God's side and Satan's side at the same time. A choice must be made.

Another lesson in His great sermon is that God does not want people to worry about what to eat or what to wear. Jesus said that the loving Father will take care of His faithful ones, just like He takes care of the small birds.

One very important thing that Jesus taught was to "seek first the kingdom of God" and our Lord would take care of all other things. We must always put God first, obey Him, pray, have faith in Him, thank Him.

In Matthew 7:12 we find what man has called the "golden rule." This means that we should treat others as we want to be treated. We must forgive, be kind, loving, and good to others – just as we want them to be to us.

Jesus spoke about many other things in this great sermon. He taught about judging others. The Lord spoke about ones who taught something false.







Who Should Worship?





God blessed the first home with a baby son. They named him Cain. I know Adam and Eve were so happy with their new baby son. After a while, another baby boy was born. His name was Abel. Two boys playing together, growing up together. Do you think they ever fussed with each other?

In this first family, everyone had a job. Cain worked with the ground, growing food. Abel became a shepherd, His job was to watch after and take care of the sheep.

God had given this first family instruction about offering sacrifice to Him. This was to them like our worship of God today.

One day Cain and Abel brought a sacrifice to be offered. Cain brought something to God that he had grown in the field. Abel brought a lamb. God was pleased with Abel's sacrifice and was unhappy with Cain's sacrifice.

Cain became VERY angry and sad when he saw that God was happy with Abel's sacrifice and not with his sacrifice. He was jealous of his brother. He was so angry that he killed his brother. In our next lesson, we will study more about what Cain did to Abel.

Abel offered the sacrifice that God told them to offer. Abel obeyed God. Cain did not obey God! Can you guess why Cain offered the things that he had grown? Do you think he meant to disobey God?

Today, God has written in the Bible how we are to worship Him. We are to sing, pray, teach, give and partake of the Lord's Supper. If we want to please God, we must do **exactly** what God said do.

Cain sinned in not obeying God. Cain was punished. If we do not obey God, we will be punished.

God gave them another son. His name was Seth. The Bible tells us that Adam and Eve also had other sons and daughters.








Genesis 28

Isaac gave a blessing to his son Jacob. Isaac then wanted Jacob to go back to the land of his mother's people to find a wife. Rebekah also wanted Jacob to leave because she was afraid that Esau would kill him since he was so angry because of his birthright. Isaac did not want Jacob to marry one of the daughters of Canaan because they were a wicked and idolatrous people.

Jacob started on his journey. When night came, Jacob came to a place to rest for the night. In those days, people slept on the ground under the stars. Jacob took some stones and used them for a pillow. He went to sleep.

As Jacob slept, he dreamed of a ladder which reached from heaven to the earth with angels of God going up and down the ladder. The Lord stood above the ladder and gave this blessing, "I am the Lord God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed. And thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth ... and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed. "The Lord further promised, "I am with thee, and will keep thee in all places whither thou goest, and will bring thee again into this land, for I will not leave thee." (Gen. 28:13-15). When Jacob woke up, he said that the Lord surely is in this place.

Jacob rose early the next morning and took the stones which he had used for a pillow and made a pillar and poured oil over it. Jacob vowed that if the Lord would be with him, protect him, give him bread to eat and raiment to put on and bring him safely back to his father's house, then the Lord would be his God. He also said, this pillar shall be God's house, and he promised to give a tenth to the Lord.

We will learn next about Rachel and Leah. They were Laban's two daughters. Jacob wanted Rachel for his wife, and was willing to work a long time for Laban for her.
